Property owners elect new board members at Annual Meeting

Pinnacle Falls held its 2013 Annual Meeting on Saturday, July 20 at the Clubhouse. About 20 property owners were in attendance for the meeting and lunch afterwards.

In addition to reports from the board, as well as BalRidge Management, and the various committees, on Pinnacle Falls' state of affairs, an election was held for the POA board of directors. The board's inaugural chairman, Ralph Johns, and vice chairman, Abe Shor, rotated off the board at the meeting.

As a result of the election by property owners present at the meeting and absentee ballots, Gayden Gauthier and Grady Nance were elected to the POA Board, joining Ron Hertwig, Rod Patteson, and Yvette Freeman Rash. Gayden and Grady will serve two-year terms rotating off in July 2015, along with Yvette, whose term expires that same year. The new board has yet to determine its officers.

Additional action items during the meeting included the following:

- Clubhouse Reservation Guidelines. Social Committee co-chairs Carol Fife and Gayden Gauthier, along with Andy Kinigson, were asked by the board to draft guidelines for usage of the clubhouse after a request was received by a non-property owner. Andy presented the draft at the July 20 board meeting and the item was included on the Annual Meeting agenda. The guidelines, which do not allow for non-property owners to use the clubhouse unless they are immediate family of a property owner and accompanied by the property owner at all times during the event, including setup and cleanup, were approved by the board and are now in effect. Brewer Stadium in Boone, NC at an elevation of 3,333 feet and climbed to an elevation of 4,279 feet where it ended on Grandfather Mountain in Linville, NC. The course ran through the North Carolina Blue Ridge Mountains, over the Blue Ridge Parkway, up long steep climbs to McRae Meadows where runners were greeted by the sound of bagpipes and thousands of spectators.

Renee finished the marathon in five hours, eight minutes, and 53 seconds, ranking 297 out of 381.


