Board approves installation of new fire hydrant

The Property Owners Association (POA) Board met on Saturday, June 29.

During the meeting, the board approved installation of an additional fire hydrant on Misty Ridge Way. Currently there is one wet fire hydrant just outside of the Pinnacle Falls entrance on Pinnacle Falls Road, another wet hydrant in the Forest area of Pinnacle Falls on Pinnacle Falls Lane, and a dry hydrant in the Pinnacle Falls pond.

ARB Chairman George Rash and Property Manager AJ Ball were asked by the board to research the feasibility of adding additional fire hydrants in the community, particularly in the Meadows area and in the lower region of Pinnacle Falls, which have clusters of homes. Due to having smaller water lines in the lowest and

farthest areas of the community near Eagle Ridge Road, and the need to have areas for a fire truck to turn around, a traditional sixinch fire hydrant is not feasible. However, a post flush hydrant, which works specifically for areas with smaller water lines, would work in three different areas of the community that have flush valves.

Since the homes along Eagle Ridge Road do not have a hydrant close by, the board unanimously approved spending the funds to install one post flush hydrant this year on Misty Ridge Way, which is just off of Eagle Ridge Road.

The board will consider installing an additional hydrant in the Meadows area next year; and additional hydrants in other areas as more homes are built.

Dairy Day held downtown

Hendersonville residents were treated to free ice cream and a parade of about 30 vintage milk trucks downtown on Saturday, June 29.



After the parade, several of the trucks were displayed to the public as part of the 2013 Midwest Milkman's Reunion and DIVCO (Detroit Industrial Vehicle Company) Club Convention.

DIVCO milk trucks harken back to when fresh dairy products were delivered to residents' doorsteps each week. The trucks are now all privately owned. There are 500 owners who hold bi-annual conventions around the U.S.

New milk delivery service available

A new milk delivery service is now available in Western North Carolina.

Jonathan Flaum, 44, of Asheville, started Farm to Home Milk in January, delivering products such as bottled farm glasses of milk, eggs, bread, meat, poultry, and more, from his refrigerated truck to customers' homes. He picks up the milk on Mondays from Maple View Farm in Chapel Hill, NC, and then makes deliveries throughout the week. Additional products, such as goat milk, eggs, bread, fish, beef, pork, coffee, and more, are provided by companies in Western North Carolina.

Although Farm to Home Milk delivers mostly in the Asheville and northern Hendersonville County area, the company does have drop off locations in other areas of Western North Carolina. Flaum recently expanded his route to Fletcher and plans to have a central drop-off location in Hendersonville.
