Hosted by the Four Seasons go to Jump Off Rock. Rotary of Hendersonville, and sponsored by Park Ridge Health, the event offered nearly 1,000 cyclists three different routes to choose from — the Honey Crisp Unbelievable, 100 miles with six mountain climbs over 8,000 feet of ascent on Sugarloaf Mountain, Pinnacle Mountain, and Jump Off Rock; the Gala Challenge, 100 kilometers with three mountain climbs over 3,000 feet of ascent on

Sugarloaf Mountain, Bearwallow Mountain, and Terry's Gap; and the Green Apple Easy, meant for novice cyclists, and just 25 miles with only 1,000 feet of ascent.

Four Seasons Rotary hopes to make the Tour d'Apple an annual event as part Hendersonville's annual Apple Festival Weekend activities.
