Tips for Keeping Bears Away from Your Home



Garbage Disposal

Don't store garbage outside or in your vehicle. Pickup truck toppers are not bear-proof, and we must remember that it is the smells that draw bears to a specific location.

Compost Heaps

Limit what you place in your compost heap. Avoid placing any meat by-products such as fish, meat, bones, egg shells, dairy products, or fruit into your compost. Adding some lime to your compost can also speed up decomposition and reduce the smell.

BBQs

The smell of a juicy steak can permeate the air and attract much more than envious glances from non-barbecuing neighbors. These same smells attract bears to your deck once you head to bed. When you're done barbecuing, make sure to burn the food off of the grill, or at least clean the grill carefully. Also, if you store your grill outside, be sure to use a cover to reduce the smell emanating from it. Keeping your patio door closed when cooking indoors also helps to reduce the smell of food in the air.

Bird Feeders

Be sure to wait until late November before filling your bird feeder with seed, and don't forget to take it down before the bears come out in spring, usually by early March. Also, don't store bird seed outside.
